Site Coordinators


Shelley Doucette, NHCS

Dear NASD Families!

Please allow me to introduce myself. I am the new Program Director for Project PROMISE and I would like to thank you all for inviting me into your wonderful community! My first month here has been a great one—everyone that I have met has been extraordinarily kind and welcoming.

Let me begin by sharing with you how excited I am to join Project PROMISE. I am extremely passionate about providing quality afterschool programming and my goal is to help foster an afterschool environment where children, from kindergarten to high school, can feel safe, valued, respected, and given creative opportunities to grow and learn. To achieve this, we will be starting a few new initiatives this year.

The first initiative is focused on helping our kids build self-esteem and confidence and feel a sense of belonging. To achieve this, Site Coordinators will be mailing home a 'Positive Postcard' for each child every session. This postcard will share a positive story about the child from the session—it may be a new skill they mastered, a new interest they discovered, or a story highlighting great behavior. The second initiative is designed to help our staff better know and serve our kids. Included in this registration packet is a "My Owner's Manual" sheet. We ask that parents and guardians please help their children to complete the questions and return it with the registration form so that we may begin to "get to know" your child before they even arrive for program!

While we are very excited about these additions to Project PROMISE, I am also pleased to report that we will be remaining consistent with last year on tuition and fees, hours of operation, and our partnership with the TTCC to provide programming on Fridays, teacher workshop days, and scheduled early release days. In all of these respects, there will be no changes.

Once again, I would like to thank you for the wonderful welcome to the Newfound community and I am looking forward to beginning a fantastic year!
